

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) doesn't have an official standard for heat safety, but it plans to release official regulations soon, providing long-awaited clarity and guidance. Following the OSHA national emphasis program



recommendations, their Heat Prevention Guide, and NIOSH's Recommended Heat Standard guidance is a good start. Until OSHA promulgates a hazard-specific standard, protecting your employees from heat stress falls under their General Duty Clause.

California, Minnesota, and Washington are states that have existing regulations that can be used as examples of expanding requirements regarding this health hazard.
